

GEORGETOWN SCORES 64 POINTS AT MEET

LeGendre, Georgetown Star Largest Individual Point Gainer.

Charlottesville, Va., May 13—Seven records were smashed and two others were equalled in the South Atlantic Inter-Collegiate field and track meet here today which was won by Georgetown with a score of 64 points.

LeGendre, Georgetown star, was the largest individual point-winner, taking five firsts.

The records broken were the broad jump by LeGendre, with 23 feet, the high jump by Chamberlain, of Virginia, with 6 feet, + 3-4 inches, the two-mile run by Booth, of Johns Hopkins, 9 minutes, 34 3-5 seconds, the half-mile by Marsters, Georgetown, 1 minute, 55 1-5 seconds, the pole vault by Zundel, Virginia, 11 feet, 11 1-2 inches; the javelin throw by LeGendre, 174 feet, 4 inches and the shot-put by Beers, Maryland, 44 feet, 1 1-2 inches.

The records equalled were the quarter-mile by Herlihy, Georgetown 50 seconds flat and the 100 yard dash by Clark, Hopkins, 10 seconds.
