

GEORGETOWN STUDENT WINNER IN CONTEST

Legendre Leads in University of Pennsylvania Relay Carnival Pentathlon; Third Victory

PHILADELPHIA, April 28.—Robert Legendre of Georgetown University won the University of Pennsylvania relay carnival pentathlon contest here this afternoon from a high class field of all round athletes. The Georgetown star scored a minimum of eight points with Reinartz of Muhlenburg College second with 17 points. Charles West of Washington and Jefferson College was third with 18 points. Legendre won three firsts, the broad jump, javelin throw and 200 metre sprint. He was second in the discus throw and third in the 1500 metre run.

Legendre in winning today scored his third victory in this all round event having won previously in 1919 and 1921. This performance ties the record of J. H. Berry, the famous University of Pennsylvania athlete who won in 1915, 16 and 17. The scores of the athletes to finish follow:

Legendre, Georgetown 8; Reinartz, Muhlenburg 17; West, Washington and Jefferson 18; Emery, Princeton 21; Clapp, Navy 24; Moroney, Georgetown 24.

Byrd of Virginia Polytechnic and Taylor, Navy, were eliminated before final event.

200 meters flat (pentathlon) won by Legendre, Georgetown. Time 22 1-2 seconds; fifth tie between Byrd, Virginia Polytechnic Institute and Moroney, Georgetown.

Interscholastic medley relay championship (first man ran 440 yards, second man 220 yards, third ran 660 yards and fourth man 880 yards) won by Exeter Academy (Lundell, Norton, Roger and O'Neil. Time 4:44 3-5.)

Running hop, step and jump, won by Hattersly, Pennsylvania; distance 42 feet 7 1-4 inches. College distance medley (first man ran quarter mile, next half mile, third three quarters and last man one mile) won by Georgetown (Kinnally, Brewster, Masters and Connolly. Time 10:29 1-5.)

Two mile international run, won by Bucker, Bates College. Time 9:35 1-5.

Throwing discus (pentathlon) won by Clapp, Navy, distance 121 feet 1-2 inches. Fifth, H. C. Byrd, Virginia Polytechnic Institute, distance 102 feet six inches.

Hammer throw won by Baker, Princeton, distance 156 feet, 1 inch.

College sprint medley (first man ran 440 yards, second and third men 220 yards and fourth man 880 yards) won by University of Pennsylvania (Lever, Gill, Holden and Brown. Time 2:22 1-5.)

1500 meters flat pentathlon, won by Emery, Princeton. Time 4:35 3-5.
