

# Legendre Wins Carnival Pentathlon; Tech at Penn Relays; Tech Meets Lebanon Nine Today

## Legendre of Georgetown Is Pentathlon Winner at Penn

Philadelphia, April 25.—P. Legendre, of Georgetown University, today won the pentathlon championship at the University of Pennsylvania relay races with fourteen points. John Bartels, of Pennsylvania, last year's winner, was second with 20 points; C. Lewis, of Missouri, was third with 21 points; S. Butler, Dubuque, fourth, 24 points; B. Eckberg, Dartmouth, fifth, 25 points; Ensign, Ohio Wesleyan, sixth, 28 points. The summaries:

440-yard hurdles—Won by G. H. Frazier, Pennsylvania; second, A. J. Brickley, Pittsburgh; third, C. Stoll, Pennsylvania; fourth, W. K. Hitchcock, Lafayette. Time, 50.1-5 seconds.

Running broad jump (pentathlon)—Won by S. Butler, Dubuque, distance 22 feet 11.1 inches, breaking Pennsylvania pentathlon record of 22 feet 2.1-2 inches, made by Worthington, of Dartmouth, in 1915; second, R. Legendre, Georgetown, 20 feet 11.718 inches; third, E. Gillilan, Notre Dame, 20 feet 4.8-4 inches; fourth, C. L. Lewis, Missouri, 20 feet 2.5-8 inches; fifth, E. Eckberg, Dartmouth, 19 feet 7-8 inch.
