

LEGENDRE WINNER OF PENTATHLON CONTEST

FRANKLIN FILLD, Philadelphia, Pa., April 13—Bob Legendre of Georgetown tried hard and failed to win a place among the super-athletes who have won all five events of the pentathlon—but he won three and captured the five-party feature of the first days sport in the big Penn relay carnival here

Legendre, who had been touted strongly to duplicate the performance of Howard Berry, the former great man of Penn, fractured a pair of carnival records, to win the javelin throw which he captured with a toss of 171 feet and in the 200 metres, which he ran in 2:33.5. The carnival pentathlon record formerly held by Bartels of Penn, was 168 feet 11¼ inches and the 200 metres had been done by Berry in :122.5 five years ago

Legendre also won the broad jump, clearing 33 feet 5½ inches. Emory of Princeton ran a great game race in the 1500 metres race, the final pentathlon event, winning in 4:33.5 with West of Washington and Jefferson second and Legendre third. Clapp of the Navy flipped the discus 131 feet one-half inch and won. Legendre was second.
