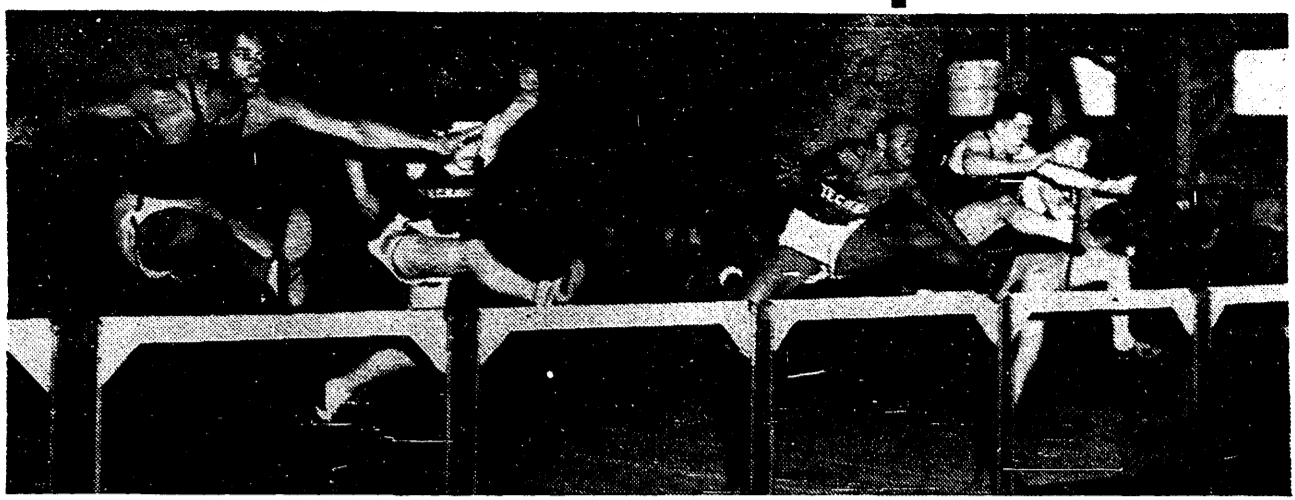
**Rain Postpones Fight**

## 2 Records Set, 3 Equalled

Defending champion Boston Technical raced to its second straight Indoor Regimental title yesterday at the East Newton Street Armory to account for its third crown in the 47 year history of the famous meet.

With the field events completed earlier in the week, Tech went into yesterday's running finals with a big edge over Latin and English. And when the final tabulation was in it had a 242.5 buldge over the second place Purple and nearly 40 over the once-unbeatable Blue and Blue.

**4 DAY MEET**  
The meet, spread over four days, produced only one double winner. That was Trade's Art Washington, who leaped to the class A broad jump title and also won the 440-yard run crown.

**OUTLEGS CHAMP**  
Porro, leading all the way, outlegged district league champ Eddie Quinn of Jamaica Plain to establish a 2:08.5 record in the run and thus shatter John Hurley's (English) 2:11.4 standard.

**TRACK TOPICS**: Latin's Howard Gray, a six foot sophomore, looked like a runner of the future as he took the C 176-yard run. . . . Joe Whalen, Charlestown, won one of the top events of the day when he a highly regarded field for the A 300 crown. Tech's Gerry Galizio had things pretty much to himself in taking the B 440 but he failed to equal the record as he did in four previous assaults at the 566 mark.

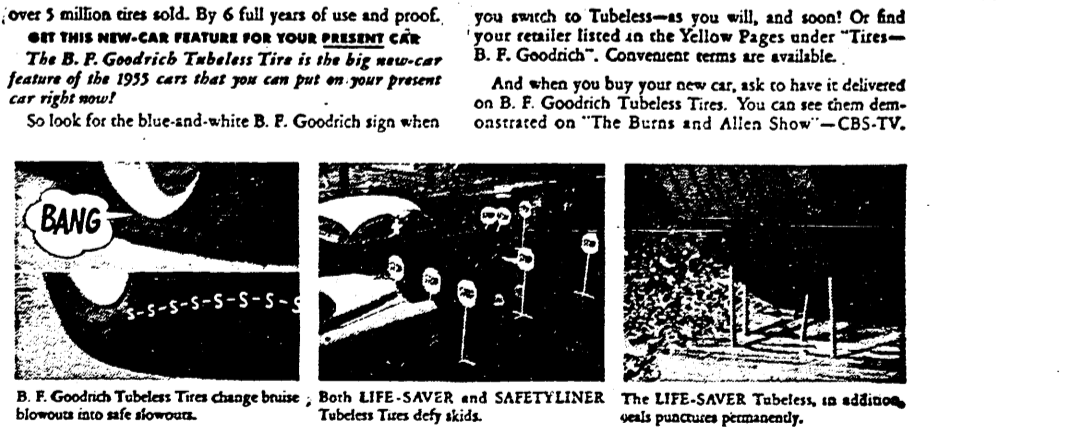
