REPORT FROM THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS 11/5/90


The Board of Directors of the Maine Track Club approved a \$100 membership for the club in the Maine Running Hall of Fame for 1990. The following proposal for the MTC Race Committee was approved:

Recruit at least two other people in addition to the chairman to do the following: Plan and produce the Maine Track Club Race Calendar in time for the January newsletter. Type the race calendar for each newsletter, including all Maine races. Inventory all race equipment and develop a check out and return system. Develop short term and long term equipment purchase goals. Update the club race manual. Plan and conduct race directors' meetings and volunteer training workshops. Recruit race directors and volunteer coordinators. Assist race directors with sponsor search. Monitor progress of each race. Check billing of management fees and insurance. Work with the certification committee. Do policy memos to race directors.








MTC AUCTION EARNS \$1579!


Newsletter Next issue will be combined Nov/Dec. Deadline is the 3rd Thursday in November. Jan/Feb will also be combined.

The Twin Cities Marathon Minneapolis, Minnesota October 14, 1990

Last Mothers Day, a bunch of us Sunday Runners were sitting around my living room talking about Marathons. Tom Atchison was contemplating his first 26 mile run and was thinking about doing it in Berlin. A number of us jumped on him immediately, convincing him that he should run his first marathon in the US, where food and sleep patterns are relatively familiar. My devious mind works quickly in rare situations of opportunity and I could see that Tom's moment of hesitation required that I make a speedy and impassioned plea. "Run Twin Cities with me in October," I begged. "It's supposed to be a gorgeous course, the weather is usually perfect and I know you have a zillion frequent flyer miles." I have to say folks, Tom is an easy mark.

He is also a training machine. Before I could say "fartlek" Tom had sent me a computer generated training schedule that the East Germans would have been proud of. (Please excuse the dated geo-political reference.) Now my idea of training is run 10 or 12 miles while the sun is still up and go get a TCBY with Resses Peanut Butter Cup topping. Tom, on the other hand, runs 15.23 miles at 6:32 am maintaining an 8:42 pace followed by 2.87 liters of water and 1.5 medium oranges. Luckily, Tom and I are separated not only by basic life philosophies, but also by geography. Therefore, we only ran together for a handful of long runs. Frankly, he made the runs bearable. Behind the beard and the drawl, it seems, beats the heart of a philosopher/comedian. We were occasionally joined by Tom's friend (and new MTC member) Malcolm "Hunka Hunka Burnin' Love" Washburn, who was also training for his first marathon. Now Malcolm sometimes fantasizes that he is the reincarnation of Elvis and sometimes his good friend Tom Atchison encourages this fantasy. It makes for pretty amusing running, even at 6 am.

Minneapolis is an incredibly beautiful city filled with the most overwhelmingly blond people I have ever seen - it made me feel positively ethnic. At the airport I heard every other woman called Ingrid - "Over here, Ingrid. Hi, Ingrid! Ingrid, meet Lars." When I got to race headquarters where I was staying the woman who checked me in had very blue eyes, long blond hair and (this is really true) a name tag that said "Ingrid."

Tom and his wife, Debbie had already arrived and Tom had done restaurant research prior to his arrival. So Friday night we met up with Tom's brother Dennis and friends of his from Florida and walked over to a wonderful Italian restaurant for dinner. 19

This was beautiful tree-lined midwestern street, with stately Victorian homes. The leaves were at the peak of color, there were blond children playing in the yards...it was a picture almost too perfect to imagine. Little did I know I would be cursing under my breath the entire length of that street 24 hours later. We had a nice little run, a big breakfast, a quick tour of St. Paul, then it was back to the hotel for the Expo. Later that evening we went to another great Italian restaurant for more pre-race carbos.

In spite of dire predictions of rain and wind, Sunday turned out to be a picture perfect marathon day. (Actually a few clouds to break that wholesome, unrelentingly cheerful midwestern sun would have been nice.) Though it was cool and dark when we left the hotel, we were grateful it wasn't any warmer later in the day.

All the advertising for this race is true. It is "the country's most beautiful urban marathon." The course winds through Minneapolis and St. Paul around lakes, through lovely neighborhoods and parks. Bands play, crowds cheer, and the hills are minimal and gentle. I kept pace with Tom for almost 13 miles, when I started to slow down. That was the last I saw of his neon green checked running tights until the finish line.

Tom finished in 3:59 and I struggled in at 4:02, one very tired buckaroo. It was the last time I ran for six weeks, having sustained a few stress fractures on the way. Tom, on the other hand, had a very respectable time at the Great Pumpkin race two weeks later. I can't wait to get him to start training for our next marathon. Where can I convince him to go? I know! There's a real neat marathon in Moscow in August. Oh, Toooooom!
