News-Run Notes

Now is the time to renew your membership

We'd like to remind everyone that as of Jan. 1, 1999, the fee for an individual membership will become the same as that for a family membership: \$20. There will now be only two categories of membership — household (\$20) and student (\$12). Student memberships will increase to \$12. Individual and student members can save a few bucks, however, by renewing before the end of the year. Anyone who renews by Dec. 31, 1998, will receive their 1999 memberships at the old rates: \$15 for individuals and \$10 for students.

Phil Pierce: 10 x 100 — miles, that is

In any of you wondered why you didn't see Phil Pierce at this year's NYLCare Maine Marathon, his absence was due to teh fact that he was in the process of completing his 10th 100-mile trail race — the Arkansas Traveler.

The race actually began a day earlier, on Saturday, Oct. 3. Phil reports that the course covered trails and old jeep and logging roads in the Ouachita Forest. The rocks on the course impeded the progress of many runners during the night, as did the 77-degree heat and 95- to 100-percent humidity during the day.

Phil finished at 8:47 a.m. Sunday morning, for a total time of 26 hours, 47 minutes and 15 seconds. He placed 34th in a field of 125 starters and was one of only 49 runners to complete the course within the 30-hour cutoff. Joe Hilderbrand of Ohio was the overall winner in 17:02, and ultra legend Ann Trason (18:03) took first in the women's division. Only two other runners finished in less than 20 hours.

Next up for Phil is the Rocky Raccoon 100-Mile Trail Race in Huntsville, Texas, on Feb. 6. His goal is to break 24 hours.

Lane 11th in NCAAs

Former MTC High School Runner of the Year Matt Lane earned All-America honors for the fourth time in his collegiate career when he finished 11th at the NCAA Division I Cross Country Championships in Kansas. Lane, a junior, completed the 10K course in 30 minutes, 36 seconds. The Yarmouth native is now a two-time cross country All-American, a distinction he has also earned once in both indoor and outdoor track.

Congratulations are also in order for Ellsworth High School senior Louie Luchini, who recently won the New England High School Cross Country Championship, then qualified for the Foot Locker National Championships with a sixth-place finish in the Northeast Regional.


