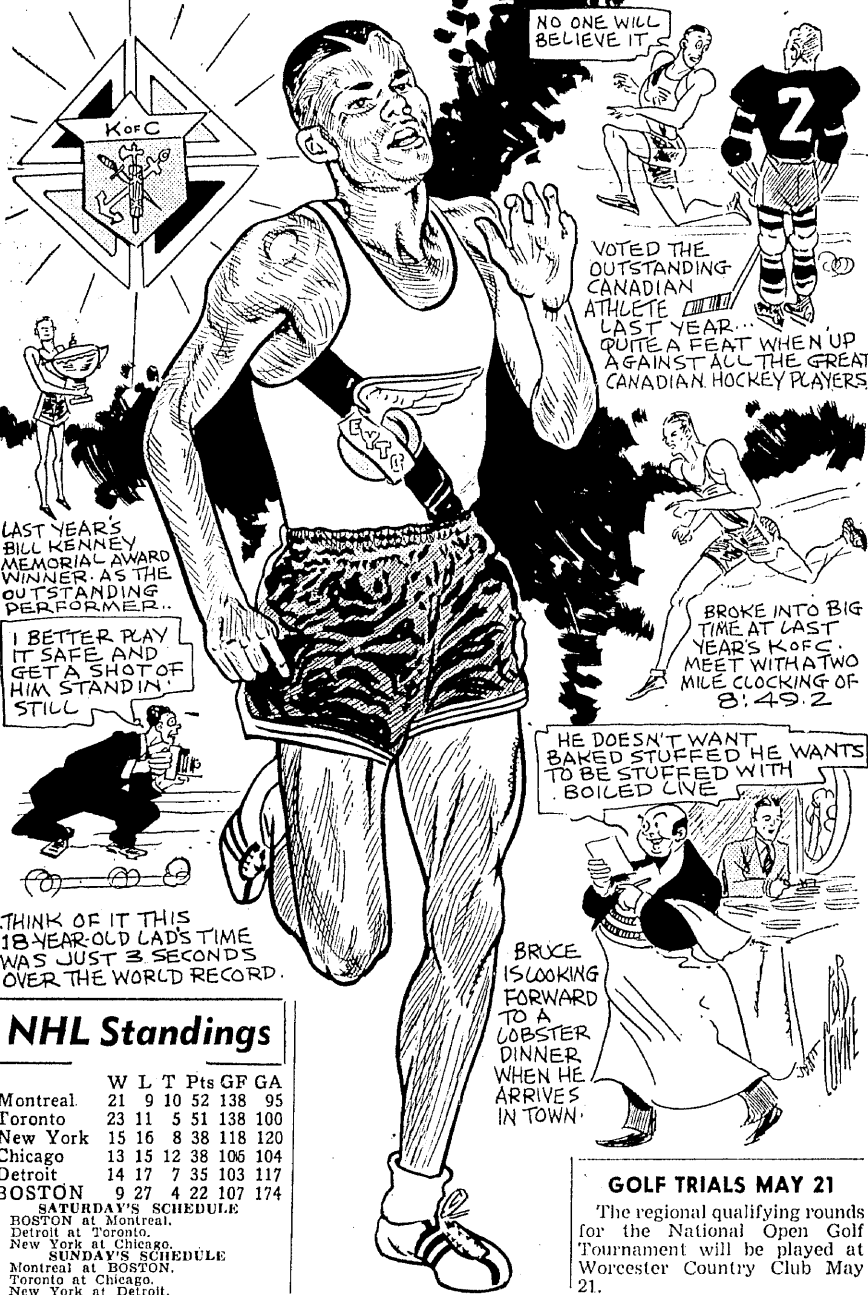

He went on, "From now on we'll have only the cream of the local crop as the boys will have to make the grade at the Boston Garden and in front of every good track official in the State."

**TRACK TOPICS:** Defending BAA champ Hope High of Providence will have its hands full trying to hold off Boston Trade, Boston English and St. John's of Danvers... according to our figuring, it looks like Boston Trade in as close a finish as the meet has had—Trade 19 points,

Hope 18, Boston English 17 and St. John's of Danvers 16.

**ICE CHIPS:** Plenty of good hockey remains on the weekend agenda as four leagues are due to see action on Saturday, two at Lynn and a pair at Boston Arena.

The big game of the day takes place up on the North Shore as Middlesex leader Melrose skates against runnerup Belmont in the finale of the loop's afternoon program.

The Red Raiders had a 7-0 win in their initial meeting and have gone on to win six more on top of this. Belmont recovered well enough to win its next six, four on shutouts. Belmont has the top two scorers in the league in Bob Gardiner (10-8-18) and Seve Bettencourt (9-7-16) while the Raiders counter with Bill Hardy (7-5-12) and Jim Umile (3-8-11).

High jumper John Thomas, suddenly the forgotten man of track, will attempt to regain the spotlight at Boston Garden Saturday night where he competes in two events as one of the highlights of the 36th Knights of Columbus Track Meet.

Thomas competes against Marine Lt. Bob Gardner of Quantico and Kevin O'Brien of Holy Cross in his major event, the high jump. He also will race as a member of the B. U. relay team.

Promoters claim it's a bad year for track, but Knights director Ding Dussault seems to have corralled an excellent field and a number of records figure to be broken in the course of the night.

Among other highlights are: Bruce Kidd, the 18-year-old University of Toronto freshman, who will seek to break his own two-mile record, established here last year (8:49.2) when he started the track world by winning as a schoolboy.

The 50-yard dash where Frank Budd, world 100-yard record holder at 9.2 and K of C record-holder and defender at 5.2 will seek to better his mark.

A girl's 880-yard run. They won't set any records, but this latest innovation will be a welcome break from the steady pounding of the men. Heading the field will be pretty Julia Chase, the Smith College runner whose efforts to race against men in the marathon were defeated. Too bad. She's a lot easier on the eyes than old John Kelley.

Elsewhere around the teaming Garden oval there will be such events of interest as the 600 and the Cardinal Cushing 1000. George Kerr, Jamaica Olympian from Illinois is favored in the 600, for which he holds the indoor record, 1:09.3. His competition will be from Art Evans of New York, Carl Christensen, former B. U. star, and Toronto's George Shepard.

The 1000 is a take-your-pick field with Jay Bowers of Holy Cross and the New York A. C.; Charlie Durant, former Drake halfmiler; Bill Crothers of Toronto; John Baxter of Kentucky; Tom Farrell of St. John's and Frank Thomas of Fordham rated equal.

Four defenders are returning from last year. In the hurdles, Bill Johnson, ICA champion out of Maryland, will face the challenge of Olympian Willie May, Villanova's Leon Pras and Yale's Jay Luck.

In the mile, Deacon Jones attempts to better his 1961 clocking of 4:07.1, third fastest in K.C. history, against Toronto's Donal Smith, Quantico's Peter Close, Villanova's Vic Zwolick and Marine Lt. Carey Weisiger.

The pole vault finds Rolando Cruz of Villanova looking to do better than last year's performance of 14-9. In summer competition he hit 15-5.

Thirteen varsity and freshman relay events provide a back-drop for the feature events.

Hottest relays of the night figure to be the two final events with Villanova, Georgetown, Fordham, NYU, Syracuse and Seton Hall hooked up in a two-mile battle. Villanova, NYU and St. John's duel in the one-mile finale.
