

Air Force vs. Army In TV Bowling

Air Force Sergeant Harry Teems will drive North from Buzzards Bay Saturday to bowl against Army Captain Bill Muir.

"If I lose," says Teems, "I've been advised to keep driving north."

The match will be televised on WBZ-TV's (Channel 4) Ten Pin Time from 12:45 to 1:45 p.m.

Teems is a 16-year veteran of service in the Air Force. The advice to "keep driving if you lose" has been given him by his buddies at Camp Otis Air Base, Falmouth.

"Actually," explains Teems, "the guys at Otis are a pretty good lot. It's simply that Saturday's match pits Army against the Air Force and the Air Force doesn't want to lose it."

Teems is identified as Bowler Number 2 in this week's exciting Traveler Ten Pin Contest. Muir,

the defender, is designated as Bowler Number 1.

Muir won the right to reign as champ when he ousted three-time winner Dick Brown last Saturday. A 30-year-old resident of Littleton, Muir is stationed at Ft. Devens.

Veteran

Teems is 40 and the father of a 16-year-old son. The Teems', natives of Miami, Fla. live in the Lakeside Grove Trailer Camp, Buzzards Bay.

Teems is a veteran of World War II and recipient of the Distinguished Flying Cross, the Silver Star and the Air Medal.

He is attached to the 60th Fighter Squadron at Otis as a ground safety supervisor.

He admits he's been bowling "for about 25 years." The fact he'll be on television Saturday isn't scaring Teems either.

"I was on seven bowling shows in Miami. I won six of the seven."

"Television won't scare me," Teems insists. "I watched Muir last week and I have to admit he looks good. We shall see what we shall see."

Baylor Paces NBA Scorers

NEW YORK (AP)—Elgin Baylor of the Los Angeles Lakers has grabbed first place in the National Basketball Association scoring race.

But it seems only a matter of time before Philadelphia's Wilt Chamberlain regains his accustomed perch at the top.

League statistics released today show Baylor averaging 30 points a game. He has scored 270 points in nine games for a 46-point edge over runner-up Oscar Robertson of the Cincinnati Royals, who is hitting at a 24.9 clip.

Chamberlain, last year's scoring champion as a rookie, leaped from eighth place to third after last week's games with 206 points and a 34.3 average. The Warrior ace has played in three less games than the two leaders.

Jack Twyman, Robertson's teammate with the Royals and the runner-up Chamberlain in the 1959-60 point battle, is fourth with 194 points—one more than New York's Willie Naulls.

Then as a sophomore in high school I decided to try track.

"I discovered I liked track better than anything else in sports. I've been working at it ever since. I haven't found another sport to replace it for relaxation."

A 4:25 miler in high school, Lowe has concentrated on distance work at Brown.

Last summer he captured the ICA steeplechase and three-mile championship on the same day.

Later he beat Jimmy Greene, Saugus road-racing school teacher, in Chatham's 10-mile road race.

"It was then I thought I might have a chance to make the Olympic team in four years," he says.

Greene was nosed out of an Olympic Marathon berth by the acceptance of former Boston University star Johnny Kelley.

Today Lowe is regarded as Kelley's superior at the same stage in their careers.

More Potential

"I hesitate to compare runners usually," says Fuqua. "I hesitate especially when one of the runners happens to be a boy I have coached."

"I have nothing against Kelley. He is great and has been great. But I do think Lowe has more potential than Kelley."

"I think Bobby is a bit strong-

er. He stands a little over 5:10 and he weighs about 140.

"I also think he might have a bit more natural speed than Johnny."

"He never has run the mile for us in college competition. But he has run a 9:11 two-mile."

"That's without actual preparation for that distance."

"I also know he's a great competitor. I won't say what his best distance might be."

"It could be the steeplechase after what he did last summer."

"It could be the 10,000 meter run. It could be the marathon."

"It's up to Bobby to pick the distance. He has a great capacity for work and can do what he pleases."

"I say only that he is potentially the best distance runner I have ever seen in the United States."

Brown's Dave Farley was the freshman winner with a 14:38 clocking. . . . He was followed by Kevin Callahan of Holy Cross and Gene Colburn of Mass. . . . The time difference between the first and third places was only 14 seconds.

When my hook ball is on the beam, it means I'm getting all the action I need for big totals.

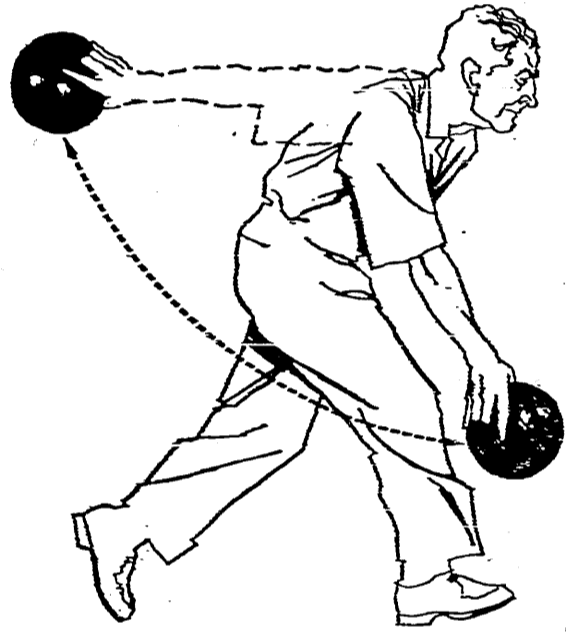
I always check my delivery if my scores are bad to see if I'm throwing the ball with the same kind of hook I used in
