

FLANDERS 3-MILE REPEATER; PORTLANDERS SWEEP TESTS

Defender Ken Flanders, Deering High School, made it two straight Saturday in the sixth annual Road Race sponsored by the Lewiston Recreation Department and the Lewiston High Interact Club. Flanders led the three-mile group home in 13:40.8, well below last year's 14; 06.8 performance but still shy of the 13:39.8 record held by Bob Hillgrove, Rockland.

Others in the first five were Fred Judkins, Bangor; Bill Wilson, Bath. Ralph Grant, Winthrop and Steve Fillow of Bates College.

Deering teammate David McDonald, won the two-mile event in 9:44.8 to better the 1968 9:56.2 performance of Wayne Audette, also of Deering. Rounding out the top five were Merle Wagg, Bath; Ken Ribeau, Biddeford; George Johnson, Brunswick and John Maskut, Portland.

Portland made it a sweep when David Rundin won the one-mile event in 6:20.3, better than Chris McMorro's winning 6:46.4 time in '68. Bruce Lotta, Bath; Robert Perry and Gary Plamonden, Biddeford and James Wagg, Portland, rounded out the top five. Scott Flanders, Jordan, finished sixth.

Daniel Campbell, in 16th place, was the first Twin City finisher in the three mile event and Mickey Provencher, in 12th place, was the first local to cross the finish line in the two-mile event.

Trophies went to the first three finishers in the three-mile test and medals to the next eight finishers. The first two places in the two-mile run received trophy and medals went to the next eight finishers. The mile winner received a trophy and the next five finishers received medals.
