

# Penquis Relays spark hot track competition



**DOVER-FOXCROFT**  
Track teams from five Penquis area schools, Foxcroft Academy, Dexter, Lincoln, Greenville, and Nokomis, rallied in Dover-Foxcroft Saturday afternoon for the annual Penquis Relays.

Honors in the meet were earned by the Dexter squad with 93 points. Dexter athletes earned points for their school in all 14 events, picking up first place in six events and setting new records for the mile and triple jump.

Foxcroft Academy moved into second slot in the relays with men ranked among the top five competitors in every event except pole vault.

Foxcroft tallied 59.5 points while Lincoln scored 28 points Greenville 27.5 and Nokomis 11.

Five records fell during the afternoon. Al Cooper of Nokomis topped the javelin record of 160-2 ft set by Rattigan of Dexter in 1970. Cooper turned in 168.5 ft while Rattigan had to settle for second spot even though he bested his 1970 effort with 160-4 ft.

Lowell of Lincoln made a bid for both the shot put and discus records. He succeeded in burying the old 45-8 ft record held by Johnston, also of Lincoln, but missed the discus mark by only 2 1/4 ft. For shot, however Lowell set a new mark of 60 ft 1/2 in., bettering the old standard by more than four feet.

Dexter's Young shaved four seconds from the record time in the mile to post a new time of 4:45.4. N. Johnson of Greenville turned in 2:09 for the 800-yr event and cut down the old 2:13.1 record.

John Hartford of Dexter established a new mark for triple jump. He tallied 39-6 1/2 ft. to break the two year old record of 33-11 ft. set by McCormick of Lincoln.

Dexter now leads the pack by holding six records, Lincoln and Nokomis hold two records each, and Greenville, Foxcroft and Warsaw each hold a single record.

Lovell of Lincoln who came within 2 1/2 ft. of breaking the 140-1 record set by Warsaw's Clanchette in 1970. Dow also placed third in javelin and third in shot put to aid the Foxcroft effort.

Foxcroft Academy Athletic Director Ernest "Lap" Lary was reported in good condition Monday after an accident at the Penquis District Relay Races Saturday afternoon in Dover-Foxcroft.

Mr. Lary was apparently struck on the head by an upright standard for the pole vault when it gave way during the event. He was treated by Dr. Francis Bradbury before being transferred to Eastern Maine Medical Center, Bangor.

On Sunday Dr. Carl Lewis of Bangor performed surgery to remove two bone splinters from the skull.

The Foxcroft Academy director was removed from the intensive care unit on Monday.

# Drug abuse cases heard in high court

Superior Court trials resulting from the largest anti-drug campaign ever conducted in Piscataquis County were heard this month before the Hon. Thomas E. Delahanty of Lewiston.

The cases were related to charges of violation of drug laws stemming from a midnight police raid of a party in a Greenville trailer home and a Guilford residence Dec. 3 and Dec. 5.

Charged with knowingly present where marijuana was kept were Thomas A. Beckwith, 28 of Shirley, Donald J. Gauvin, 20 of Greenville and John R. Morrill, 24 of Greenville. Each entered a guilty plea and was fined \$350.

Gary Goulet, 24 of Greenville was charged with possession of marijuana. He also entered a guilty plea and was fined \$350. Goulet was charged also with sale of marijuana and pleaded not guilty. This case was dismissed.

In other action Edward Larrabee, 18, of Greenville received a suspended sentence of five months in the county jail and two years probation after pleading guilty to a charge of possession of marijuana.

Richard A. Warren, 21, of Dover-Foxcroft entered a plea of guilty to sale of marijuana and was sentenced to the county jail for 11 months with six months of the sentence suspended. In addition he must be on probation for two years with the condition he seek psychiatric evaluation and counseling.

Additional sentencing from the drug investigations in December are scheduled to take place in Superior Court this week.

**Atkinson camp destroyed in fire**

Fire destroyed a woods camp in Atkinson Tuesday afternoon and endangered nearby stands of trees during a period of 80-deg weather and dry breezes.

The camp, unoccupied at the time was owned by Greg Dyer who was out of town. The blaze was seen by Arthur Parker and David Kinney from a nearby home. Mr. Parker notified Piscataquis County Sheriff's Dept by telephone. When Mr. Kinney arrived at the scene, the entire camp was engulfed in flames.

Earlier, Charles Goodine, fencing on a nearby farm, heard an explosion which may have been the beginning of the blaze.

Dover-Foxcroft firemen responded immediately to the alarm, but the building was consumed by flames when they arrived. Chief Clifford Pembroke directed crews to contain the fire which was spreading to adjacent woods.
