HCI banquet hears State AL Commander speak on young people

CHARLESTON
 "The people of Maine are on the right track in the current dialogue between students-citizens government," Maine American Legion Commander Daniel E. Lambert of Orrington, told the annual Junior-Senior Banquet of Higgins Classical Institute on May 21 at Tracy Hall.

The Legion chief praised the role of young people and urged that interest and discussion by various generations be used as a "method of promoting the best interest of the Pine Tree State."

Mr. Lambert, a member of the national Public Relations Commission of the Legion took the opportunity to warn his listeners on the activity of extremist groups in the nation. "If we allow the left or right, and extreme groups at both ends of the spectrum to take over in the nation, we will never recover the freedom we lose," Lambert reported.

He lashed out at some "hate groups" who seek in his words "to put one group against another, one age against another-generation, and our petty feelings to divide us."
